Bishop Samuel N. Hancock Founder



INITIATIVES & PARTNERSHIPS

Ministerial Excellence Center (MEC)

In partnership with the Lilly Endowment, the PCAFI established the MEC which is dedicated to the advancement and education of the pastors of the organization. New programs are continually added for ongoing growth and development.

Ministerial Excellence Fund (MEF)

As a recipient of a grant from the Lilly Endowment, the PCAFI established the MEF to address economic challenges facing its pastors which inhibit their abilities to minister effectively. Once a calendar year, pastors are able to submit grant applications for financial support for emergencies and burdensome debts. The MEF also makes scholarships available for pastors and/or their legal dependent children seeking to advance their education.

Fuller Theological Seminary

Fuller Theological Seminary provides a tuition discount for master's and doctorate level programs of study for PCAFI pastors. It also has developed an exclusive PCAFI certificate course of study. Upon completion of the six-course program, credit is given toward the completion of one course toward a master's degree.

Garrett Evangelical Theological Seminary

Garrett Evangelical Theological Seminary allows our pastors and church leaders to focus on the principled items of Mission and Money, Finance Leadership Roles, and Sound Financial Practices. Through its research, Garrett has discovered these items are needed to make better decisions for the church one may attend. These courses examine three dimensions of congregational financial stewardship which correlates with these three motivations for giving: 1) belief in the mission, 2) trust in leadership, and 3) sound financial practices. Ministries that fulfill non-profit financial responsibilities and honor these motivations experience greater sustainability. Scholarships are available for pastors, the financial leadership of the church, and the laity as desired. The strength of this partnership will be in effect by early 2024.

INITIATIVES & PARTNERSHIPS

Christian Theological Seminary (CTS)

Christian Theological Seminary offers pastors and ordained clergy the opportunity to apply for a sabbatical in the form of the Clergy Renewal Grant which is supported by the Lilly Endowment. The theme of the sabbatical is "What Makes Your Heart Sing?" The goal is to strengthen Christian congregations by providing opportunities for pastors to step away briefly from the persistent obligations of parish life. The sabbatical period is not a vacation, but a time of intentional exploration, renewal, and reflection. One objective is to help regain enthusiasm and creativity for ministry and discover what will make the pastor's heart sing.

Lutheran Social Services (LSS)

Lutheran Social Services provides financial literacy and services to support financial wellness for pastors, leaders, and members of the PCAFI at no cost. The parent body under the direction of the presiding bishop has a vision for debt relief for all members of the PCAFI. To this end, this fee has been paid for and pastors and members are able to attend free of charge. Call 800-528-2926 to make an appointment.

PCAFI Community Impact Empowerment (PCIE)

This program is designed to train pastors on the techniques and skills needed to impact their communities for the Kingdom. It provides access to skilled professionals in the area of community development, grant development, strategic funding, and more. While participation is not limited to PCAFI pastors, the program is designed with our pastors in mind.

Faith at Home

The goal of this initiative is to intensify the continued efforts to undergird and equip the families of our respective congregations, consequently strengthening local congregations, communities, and ultimately, the foundation of faith throughout all associated with our organization. The program provides a platform for regular dialogue, interaction and shared problem-solving of faith leaders with parents and caregivers in a strategically organized setting.
