Apostolic Bishops Leave for Tour Of West Africa

Rev. S. W. Hancock, presiding bishop of the Pentecostal Churches of the Apostolic Faith, Inc., and Rev. Willie Lee, assistant presiding bishop, recently left on an extended tour of Liberia on official business for the organization.

Bishop Lee, pastor of Christ Temple Church, left Indianapolis on Nov. 29 via Delta Airlines for Detroit where he met Bishop Hancock for their flight to New York City.

They were scheduled to arrive in Liberia, West Africa, on Dec. 1. During their stay in Africa the Bishops will be guests in the home of Mrs. Ida Cooper, granddaughter of the late Bishop G. L. Haywood.

Mrs. Cooper is the wife of James Cooper, commissioner of civil service in Monrovia, West Africa, and the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Ellis of Indianapolis.

A cablegram was received here from the president of Liberia stating that he would be pleased to grant audience to Bishops Lee and Hancock upon their arrival in Liberia.
